A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Many of you know that God has been impressing upon me in recent weeks the great importance of the discipline of finding "Sabbath" times and "spaces" in our lives, and for me in my life in particular. I have been trying to better to make room for Sabbath times daily or at least weekly in my life. I'm still not good at it: the Pavlovian response is deeply engrained in me - when the "bell rings" I instinctively answer it. But I'm trying.... I want to share with you here some thoughts about the Sabbath from our former Bishop and my good friend, Bishop Mike Coyner. I hope find them will vou as meaningful as have I. It was written with Clergy in mind but it rings true for everyone who follows Christ. Read on....

I recently spent 2 days at our annual clergy retreat. We gathered around a yellow bench, which has become a symbol for the words of Jesus to his first disciples, "Come away with me for a while to a quiet place."

As I have reflected on the need for Sabbath, I have these reflections to share:

1. Keeping the Sabbath is not about an excuse for laziness or poor work habits, it is about finding rest in order to maintain a busy schedule and a strong work ethic. Sports research teaches us that athletes who train 7 days a week do less well in competition than athletes who train 6 days a week and rest on the 7th. Sabbath is about rest from a busy schedule; it is not about an excuse to be lazy all the time.

- 2. Sabbath is not just about a day off, it is about a day to seek God's guidance intentionally. Sometimes we substitute "day off" for "Sabbath" but that really does not represent the Biblical model. Being a disciple of Jesus is too important to just take a day off and works best when we take Sabbath to seek God's guidance.
- 3. Self-care as a disciple is all about having strength to serve. Much of the popular literature and information about self-care seems to be mostly self-serving. Selfcare in serving Christ must be more than that – it must be self-care for the purpose of strengthening our service and witness.
- 4. Most of us, whether in professional ministry or as the lay people in ministry are not very good at Sabbath-keeping or selfcare. That fact is not so much a physical fact as it is a spiritual one. We (and I am speaking for myself

and about myself) try to run hard in ministry on our own strength, rather than taking time to rest, to seek God's guidance, and to care for ourselves.

5. While we may not have a yellow bench- a formally designated time and place, we need a designated space for Sabbath and self-care. It is not just about schedule, it is a lesson about space. Setting aside a sacred space – physically and spiritually – is the key to keeping the Sabbath.

It's me again. Where are you finding "space" in your life for Sabbath?

At our most recent Vision Team Update Meeting, we shared ways we believe God is calling us to courageously evolve in the coming years – specifically through the following Five Emphases:

- 1. Create a Church-wide MAP (Ministry Action Plan)
- 2. Enhance our Sunday morning experience to create a 2-hour culture of attending both worship and a Sunday School class
- 3. Improve our First Impressions ministries so to connect people with ministries that will help them grow as disciples of Jesus Christ
- 4. Identify a Discipleship Pathway that will challenge not-yet-believers and fully-devoted disciples to grow in their journeys with Jesus
- 5. Align and Resource ministries for greater impact in individuals' lives and in the world.
